Metro Link:

Take the Metro Blue Line, L.A.'s first light rail transit system which runs from 7th Street in Downtown L.A., to downtown Long Beach.

Long Beach Transit:

Take advantage of the city's public transportation services available both on land and water! For only \$1.25, per one-way fare, Long Beach Transit links you up with local destinations such as Belmont Shore, Alamitos Bay and Cal State Long Beach.

Passport Shuttle:

The bright red Passport Shuttle offers service to major Long Beach attractions and is free throughout the downtown area and whisks you quickly to downtown's cultural spots. During summer months, you can also hail water taxis, the Aquabus and the Aqualink, with services between the Queen Mary and Alamitos Bay Landing. All shuttles and water taxis are bicycle friendly.



Earl Burns Miller Japanese Garden Situated on the campus of CSU Long Beach, our 1.3 acre Hill and Pond Japanese-style garden was built through a generous donation from Mrs. Loraine Miller Collins in honor of her late husband Earl Burns Miller. The garden is a hybrid art form that combines typical elements of Japanese garden design within the context of its Southern California location, and the vision of its founder.



Rancho Los Alamitos is twice listed on the National Register of Historic Places - once as the sacred Tongva village of Povuu'ngna, the traditional birthplace of the native people of the Los Angeles Basin and, second, for the evolution of its significant historic landscape over time. The site includes traces of the ancestral village, an adobe-core ranch house ca.1800, four acres of lush historic gardens developed during the 1920s and 30s, and the restored working ranch barnyard of the early-mid 20th century. With the opening of the Rancho Center, the film, new exhibits and room environments feature the landscape, the people and the place over time and within the context of the development of the region and the state. This exceptional site reveals the early Tongva presence, the Spanish and Mexican periods, the ranching and farming era, and the imprint of 20th century development. A guintessential place for people to experience the living story of southern California, Rancho Los Alamitos is a microcosm of the region, past to present.

The theme of the Youth Technical Program (YTP) will be Communication. Please join us as we explore how EMC impacts the way we communicate not only around the world, but also with people and spacecraft in outer space.

The YTP will include a curated tour of the exhibitor's hall, a brief presentation introducing key-concepts of electromagnetic

compatibility, and a hands-on circuit building activity. Keeping with the theme of Communication, participants will build a model of a Deep Space Network tracking antenna, complete with a built-in motor, allowing the antenna to track objects crossing its path.

TEAM EMC BIKE



Interested in exploring some of Long Beach, California on bike with your fellow EMCS members? Join us for the 7th annual Team EMC bike ride and experience the area in a refreshing way. We will host two levels of escorted riding: Leisure and Performance. This year's route includes several options: paved bike path along the beach, surface streets along the Alamitos Peninsula to a turnaround at Alamitos Park, Rainbow Harbor and the Los Angeles River Bike Path. The Performance ride is approximately 20 – 30 miles or about 1.5 to 2.0 hours. Portions of the ride are easily shortened since much of this is an out and back type route, so the Leisure riders will turn around and head back at an agreed upon location.

A Team EMC jersey will be included for 1st-time participants on a first come first serve basis, while quantities last. Rental bikes are available from Cloud of Goods with delivery to the Hyatt on Wednesday night (rental includes a hybrid bike, helmet and lock). Synaptic Cycles offers rentals of higher grade road bikes with delivery and pick-up, but a 4-day minimum rental is required.


